AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 13.60 OF THE LARAMIE MUNICIPAL CODE TO REGULATE CITY DUMP FEES IN THE CITY OF LARAMIE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LARAMIE

**13.60.010 Generally.**

- A. The following landfill fees will be charged to all users:
  1. The sum of three dollars and twenty cents per month, for up to sixty-four gallons capacity for a household unit containing one kitchen unit serving one family group; the sum of one dollar and sixty cents per month shall be assessed for each additional can of no more than thirty-two gallons.
  2. Where there is more than one kitchen unit at one street address or in the same building, the owner must assume liability for the landfill fees for all the units, and the fee shall be three dollars and twenty cents per month for each kitchen unit;
  3. Places of business, hotels, motels, schools, and institutions in the city which have refuse collection shall be assessed according to volume; payable per month:

B. The fee imposed by this subsection shall apply to all private businesses which haul material to the city landfill for profit; to all residents and nonresidents whose loads are accepted by the solid waste manager for disposal; to all governmental entities other than the city of Laramie; and, to all private businesses which haul material to the city landfill incidental to other goods or services which they provide (such as construction trades).

Each person, who hauls any material to the city landfill for disposal shall pay a fee of two dollars and twenty-five cents per cubic yard (uncompacted) or eight dollars per cubic yard (compacted), with a minimum charge of five dollars per entry for in-city residents. Persons residing outside the city limits shall pay 120% of the established fee rounded up to the nearest quarter dollar (.25 cent interval), or six dollars per entry. An administrative procedure for determining proof of residency shall be determined, and may be modified as necessary, by the city manager or designee.

Each business, who hauls any material to the city landfill for disposal shall pay a fee of two dollars and twenty-five cents per cubic yard (uncompacted) or eight dollars per cubic yard (compacted), with a minimum charge of five dollars per entry. To receive in-city rates, private businesses that are hired to haul material shall be required to present a contract or manifest that indicates origin of the waste material.

Compacted waste shall include any demolition and construction debris delivered to the landfill. Any person or business that fails, neglects, or refuses to pay the required fee shall be denied access to the landfill until the fee is paid.

C. The solid waste manager or his designee shall impose a charge of ten dollars per load, if in his opinion the load is not adequately secured or contained to prevent the transported material from blowing or falling out of the vehicle. The fee established by this section is a charge to help with the cost of litter pickup and is not a criminal fine.

### **13.60.020 Tire disposal fees.**

A. In addition to all other charges provided by law, the following landfill fees will be charged to all users:

1. For disposal of unmounted automobile and single bead truck tires, two dollars per tire;
2. For disposal of mounted automobile and single bead truck tires, six dollars per tire;
3. For disposal of unmounted double bead truck tires, eight dollars per tire;
4. For disposal of mounted double bead truck tires, twelve dollars per tire;
5. For disposal of tires larger than double bead truck tires, eight cents per pound, if unmounted; and eight cents per pound plus ten dollars, if mounted.

B. Tire disposal fees shall be collected from the person who brings tires to the city landfill at the time the tires are brought to the landfill.

C. Tires shall be placed in the landfill at a location designated by the City Manager or designee and not at any other location.

D. Any person who disposes of a tire or tires in the landfill without paying the required fee at the time of disposal, or who places tires upon property owned or controlled by the city in a location not designated for tire disposal is guilty of a violation of this section and upon conviction shall be punished as provided in the general penalty section of this code.

**13.60.030 Community clean up days fee waiver**


A. Each year the city manager or designee shall declare and assign two days when residential access fees and volume-based fees are waived for city residents for the purpose of disposing residential waste. This provision shall not apply to commercial waste or businesses. Standard fees for disposal of tires, refrigeration units, campers, trailers, or animals shall not be waived by this provision.

This ordinance is effective immediately upon publication.
